II. REVIEW OF MINUTES – October 21, 2025

The Benefits Committee reviewed the draft minutes of October 21, 2025. Since there were no edits or objections by the Trustees, the minutes stand approved.

IV. EXECUTIVE SESSION

MOTION was made and seconded to move into Executive Session at 9:04 a.m. (Wataru/Fern) The motion passed unanimously. (Employer Trustees-4/Employee-Beneficiary Trustees-3)

The regular meeting reconvened at 9:16 a.m.

Vice Chairperson Machida reported that during Executive Session, the Board:

- Approved a recommendation to the Board to issue RFP 26-001 Dental, RFP 26-002 Vision, and RFP 26-003 Life Insurance Benefits..
- Reviewed and discussed the October 21, 2025 minutes. Since there were no edits or objections by the Trustees, the minutes stand approved.

III. NEW BUSINESS

- A. Carrier Utilization Reports for the period ending June 30, 2025
 - 1. Kaiser Permanente Semi-Annual Utilization Report
 Mr. Troy Tomita and Mr. Su Chai, Kaiser Permanente, presented their plan year end
 report through June 30, 2025 for the active employee and six-month report for the nonMedicare retiree plans noting a claims PMPM trend of 0.6% and 0.7%, respectively.
 Kaiser also reported the following for the active plans:
 - Inpatient PMPM decreased by 10.7% due to a decrease in admissions (admits per 1,000 decreased by 2.0%) and lesser complexity admissions (average length of stay decreased by 12.7%).
 - Pharmacy PMPM increased by 10.7% due to higher utilization in brand and specialty prescriptions, particularly for antidiabetic, dermatologic, and antineoplastic medications.

2. HMSA Semi-Annual Utilization Report

Mr. Chris Letoto and Mr. Isaac Yuen, HMSA, presented their plan year end report through June 30, 2025 for the active employee and six-month report for the non-Medicare and Medicare retiree plans noting a claims PMPM trend of 1.8%, 5.9%, and 1.1%, respectively. HMSA also reported the following for the active plans:

- Inpatient PMPM decreased by 7.9% due to a decrease in high cost claims from the previous year and a reduction in surgical admissions (admits per 1,000 decreased by 15.3%).
- Specialty drug PMPM increased by 37.3% driven by antineoplastic and neuromuscular agent spend. The specialty drug PMPM is significantly higher than the BOB because many self-injectables covered under the CVS drug plan for the EUTF are covered under the medical benefit for the BOB.
- Professional PMPM trend of 3.1% is driven by good utilization such as high vaccination rates and lower Emergency Department utilization.
